2020-21 GEF Highlights

Cover to Cover Summer Reading Program

This program is designed to help prevent a summer decline in Grandview students' reading skills and promote a lifelong love of reading. In May 2021 more than 1,875 students at Grandview's five elementary schools and early childhood center received their choice of 5, 7 or 10 new books. Over 15,150 books were given to students to take home and keep forever!

Trivia Night

The 11th Annual GEF Trivia Night was held virtually for the first time ever. The event raised \$4,745.93 for student scholarships and teacher grants in the Grandview C-4 School District and was the first Trivia Night to have multi-state participation. The farthest challengers logged in from Florida.

Scholarships

The foundation awarded \$19,750 in scholarships to Grandview High School's class of 2021.

GEF Awards \$4,665 in Staff Grants

The Grandview Education Foundation awarded over \$4,665 in Innovative Teaching Grants to three lucky teachers from the Grandview School District. The purpose of these grants is to help teachers implement innovative teaching ideas that help to supplement regular classroom instruction. The recipients were selected from a pool of applications from across the district and following are the programs they proposed to develop.

Soccer+ Golf + More

Mr. Kristopher Charles from Meadowmere Elementary was awarded a grant in the amount of \$665.25 for his project titled "Soccer+ Golf + More" which will be used to purchase a 9 hole mini golf course, nets, and balls to enhance students achievement in kicking a stationary ball as well as kicking a moving ball. Students will be actively participating, working safely and independently, and identifying exercises to improve fitness as well as integrating math skills.

Sustainable Living at GHS

Ms. Kyla Serrano and Ms. Pamela Burham, science teachers from GHS were awarded \$3000 for their proposal titled "Sustainable Living at GHS". Students will be designing, creating, and sustaining a greenhouse. They will learn how to plant, grow and harvest crops in an effort to maintain a healthy lifestyle and maintain a positive relationship with the environment.

Balloonification

Mr. Don Sutcliffe from GHS was awarded a \$1000 grant for his proposal called "Balloonification." Students will learn marketable skills and obtain a market value asset that will make them employable or able to start their own small business. They will not only learn artistic skills but develop business skills in working with clients. They will be crafting balloon decorations that many of us will also benefit from.
